## Format:

- I. Objectives and how your team met them (refer to your original correspondence with your Community Partner)
- 2. Challenges & how addressed
- 3. Shortfalls, what more you wish you had accomplished; which objectives did you not meet and why; anything you might have handled differently
- 4. Laurels, pat yourselves on the back, point out accomplishments
- 5. What you got out of this experience, such as:
  - service-learning
  - skills you learned
  - how you served the community
  - portfolio pieces
- 6. Hand off: instructions to partner on what to do next

Also consider / address what raw materials you will hand over, who has copyright to the material (typically the client for what you include, but your drafts are your intellectual property).

## **Grade**

Reflections will be graded according to completion of the points above.

Also, of course, since this is a journalism course, the reflection should be well written according to our high standards of grammar, expression, AP style, etc.

Since this is a team letter, each member should contribute.
